Derelict Vessel Prevention

- NWSC program is **rooted in efforts of MRCs** (Snohomish & San Juan) and interest from other MRCs
- Started with 2023 Congressionally Directed Spending funds
- Focus and funds prioritized through **multi-MRC and Tribal partner workgroup**

HOW DO I REGISTER?

1. Fill out DNR's Vessel Turn-In application (see link at right) and get pre-approved **BEFORE June 24th, 2024**.
2. Email your completed application and photos of your vessel to: dvrp@dnr.wa.gov, include "Skagit Vessel Turn-In Event" in the subject line.
3. **Prior approval is required for this event.** Space will be limited and filled in the order applications are received and approved.

We will accept vessels 34 ft or less in length.

Vessels 35 ft or larger will be reviewed on a case by case basis. If you cannot drop off your vessel at the specified location, you are encouraged to apply and if approved, transport can be coordinated or DNR can add you to the list and coordinate alternative vessel turn-in options.

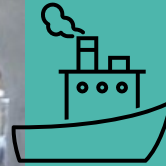

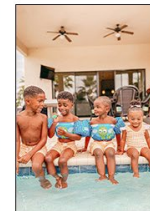
